The National Association of Black Catholic Administrators (NABCA)

The opening of several Offices for Black Catholic Ministry (OBM) in the early 1970's gave birth to the idea for a gathering of OBM Directors for mutual support and sharing. Diocesan Black Catholic leadership was necessary to impact Diocesan structures and policies from within. Five Directors had the first recorded meeting of the Black Catholic Administrators on October 7 and 8, 1976 in Rochester, NY.

Several national organizations are Affiliated members of NABCA.



ENRICHING FAITH

NABCA is dedicated to providing a forum for Black Catholic Administrators to gather and share their collective resources to effectively address the spiritual needs, issues and concerns facing the Black Catholic communities we serve. NABCA's core agenda remains prayer and the Mass, in-service training and development, collaboration locally and nationally, mentoring, and charitable service. In the 1980s and 1990s, NABCA offered its first publication, *Guidelines for the Establishment of Offices of Black Catholic Ministries in Dioceses and Archdioceses*, and a *Guideline for Mentoring*.

The goals of NABCA are as follows:

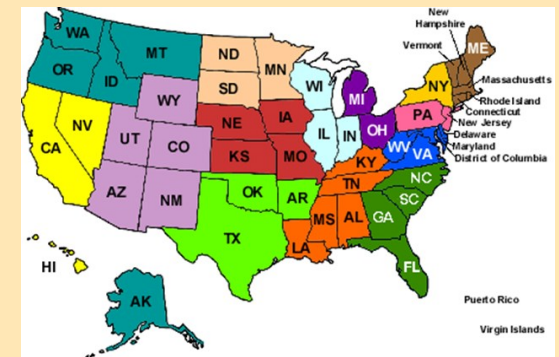
- To strive for the evangelization of our faith communities, the unchurched and the wider community.
